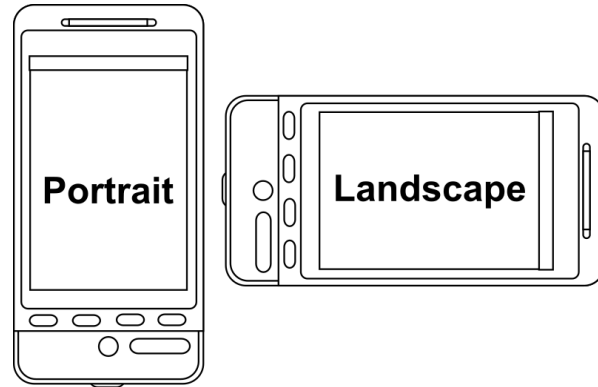


## Best Practices for Filming

Setup:

1. Make sure the camera is filming in **landscape mode** (horizontally).



2. Set up a phone on something to record to make it **stationary**. Do not hold it or have someone else hold it. Either a table, selfie stick, ledge, etc.



3. Make sure there will be **no other people in the video** (no walking in the back).
4. Make sure it is **quiet with no background noise**.

5. Try to have some sort of **light on the subject** (natural light from a window, desk lamp pointed towards face). Do not have the subject stand in front of the light. This will cause the subject to be back lit and will only look like a shadow.



6. Place the subject a little bit away from the camera to **make room for cropping** and resizing (don't have them too far away and make them look small).

Post:

1. When done filming, make sure the video is in **mp4 format** (best for Instagram). If using an iPhone, it should already record in this format.
2. For IGTV (More than 60 seconds):
  - a. Make sure the horizontal video has an **aspect ratio of 16:9**.
  - b. **For iPhones:**
    - i. Go to the photos app.
    - ii. Click on the desired video.
    - iii. Click "Edit" in the top right corner.
    - iv. Click the crop icon in the bottom right corner (looks like a square with overhanging edges and arrows. Directly next to the "Done" button).
    - v. In the top right corner click the icon that looks like 3 boxes inside of one another.
    - vi. Then click "9:16". Then click the horizontal icon in between the numbers and the video. This will adjust the crop of the video.
    - vii. Now you can drag the video up, down, left, right to fit the subject in the middle of the screen.

- viii. When the subject is fit in the middle of the video, click “Done” in the bottom right corner.
  - c. **For Androids:**
    - i. Unfortunately, Androids do not allow you to crop videos in the gallery app. You have to download a third-party video crop app.
    - ii. Once downloaded, click the option for 16:9
  - d. Videos should have a minimum frame rate of 30 FPS (frames per second) and minimum resolution of 720 pixels.
  - e. **The maximum file size for videos that are 10 minutes or less is 650MB. The maximum file size for videos up to 60 minutes is 3.6GB.**
3. For Instagram (60 seconds or less):
- a. Crop the video to 1080 x 1080 px, 1:1 ratio, or square (best for Instagram).
  - b. **For iPhones:**
    - i. Go to the photos app.
    - ii. Click on the desired video.
    - iii. Click “Edit” in the top right corner.
    - iv. Click the crop icon in the bottom right corner (looks like a square with overhanging edges and arrows. Directly next to the “Done” button).
    - v. In the top right corner click the icon that looks like 3 boxes inside of one another.
    - vi. Then click “SQUARE”. This will adjust the crop of the video.
    - vii. Now you can drag the video up, down, left, right to fit the subject in the middle of the screen.
    - viii. When the subject is fit in the middle of the video, click “Done” in the bottom right corner.
  - c. **For Androids:**
    - i. Unfortunately, Androids do not allow you to crop videos in the gallery app. You have to download a third-party video crop app.
    - ii. Once downloaded, click the option for 1:1 or Square.
  - d. **The maximum file size for 60 seconds or less is 15mb.**

Tip: Use your best judgement, if you don't think it looks professional, try another setup.
